On Forrest's coming out of the Swan he saw a light over the opposite houses, and soon met Brodist with nothing on but the remains of his shirt, and the hair all burnt off his head. He was taken to Smith's, the sweep. The foreman asked Forrest if deceased was drunk? Forrest - No, sir, he was just right. Foreman - What do you mean by being just right? Forrest - Why, just as he ought to be, Sir. Foreman - Had he been drinking? Forrest - Yes, but he was not drunk. Foreman - Well, was he in his usual state? Forrest - No, sir, he was just right; he had enough, and went to his van without anyone helping him. From the evidence of Charlotte Tims (who appeared to be in much mental agony and suffering from a tumour in the back, said to be the effects of a kick from deceased), it appeared that on the night in question a quantity of children's clothes were hung up in the van to dry, and that, although there was no fire in the van, there was a box of matches and candle, which she supposed he must have lighted and thus set the place on fire, which, in addition to bed, &c., contained 3 lbs. of powder and guns, belonging to their shooting gallery.
