The defendants were convicted and ordered to be imprisoned for ten days, but as Mr. Bullen, on behalf of the Trustees of the Turnpike Road, said he would not then press for a warrant of commitment, it was not issued, and consequently the defendants were discharged. Jesse Warner, the complainant in the above case, was charged by Edward Butler, one of the defendants in the same case, with assaulting him. The assault was alleged to have taken place at the time that the horse was released.
