He followed, however, by the regular six o'clock train, and reached Goring about half-past seven. There, however, the police interfered, and a move was made to Wallingford-road, near where the ring was formed, and the men duly commenced. Brettle was waited on by Jemmy Welch and Joe Wareham Johnny Walker and Bos Tyler "esquiring" the Norwich hero [sic]. Six rounds were fought, occupying 12 minutes, in which Mace had all the best of the contest, when the police interfered.
